Biography Aldina Topčagić



Aldina Topčagić is a contemporary dance artist, producer, and director of the Art Alive Cultural Association. Born in Bosnia, Aldina has been based in Austria since 2007 and has worked throughout Europe. In 2022, Aldina was awarded Austrian citizenship for Outstanding Achievements in Art and Culture. She has collaborated with various institutions and renowned art venues, including the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao (2019) in Spain, the Royal Museum of Fine Arts of Belgium (2017, 2018, 2019), BOZAR (2018), and Balthasar Brussels (2021) in Belgium, Artlemo Gallery Berlin (2016) in Germany, Musiikkitalo - Helsinki Music Center (2016) in Finland, Fabrica de Arte Cubano (2017) in Havana, Cuba, Novi Hram Gallery (2018) in Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bajor Gizi Museum (2018) in Budapest, Hungary, Museum of Contemporary Art Zagreb (2024), as well as several venues in Austria such as the Universalmuseum Joanneum Joanneumsviertel, Kunsthaus Graz, Künstlerhaus Papierfabrik, and Zimmerman-Kratochwill Gallery. She has

participated in productions at the Graz Opera House in the 2011/2012, 2016/2017, and 2018/2019 seasons. Aldina has trained and worked with choreographers such as David Zambrano, Jennifer Monson, Kirstie Simson, Yoshiko Chuma, Liz King, Cruz Isael Mata, and Allen Yu. Aldina's interdisciplinary projects encompass contemporary dance, music, film, photography, psychology, architecture, literature, and education. Her work explores themes of self-reflection, consciousness, identity, individuality, social dynamics, and interpersonal relationships. In May 2017, she was honored as "Artist of the Month" by the Austrian Cultural Forum/Austrian Embassy in Brussels. Aldina has created the following interdisciplinary artistic projects: "Voice of the Silence"; "Timeless in Space", "Space Series", "Living Sculpture", "Inroots"; "Transition", "Crossing Arts", "What-a-Mel-on - a performative Dialog". In 2020/2021, Aldina directed two short dance films: "couch me!" (where she also starred as the lead actress) and "What-a-Mel-on". The films received numerous nominations at international film festivals, and eight awards for "Best Experimental Film" and "Best Director" in the USA, Europe, and Asia. In 2022, she produced and co-created the short documentary "Live and Let Live - Focus on BiH". The film received the Silver Award for Best Short Documentary at the New York Movie Awards. The premiere took place at the European Parliament in Brussels as part of the "EU - Together for BiH" project, produced by Aldina Topčagić.
